As we approach the one year mark of the COVID-19 pandemic, The American Dental Hygienists' Association (ADHA) and the American Dental Assistants Association (ADAA) reiterate the need to remain vigilant in following the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidance for the health and safety of all. To support this effort, the ADHA and ADAA offer the following collaborative statement.

The American Dental Hygienists' Association and the American Dental Assistants Association support the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Interim Infection Prevention and Control Guidance for Dental Settings during the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) Pandemic. Together we encourage all members of the dental team, including dental assistants and dental hygienists, to follow the CDC recommendations including proper use of personal protective equipment (PPE) and infection control protocols.
